Brass Favourites

This collection of 'Brass Favourites' comprises a varied selection of marches, transcriptions and solos. It features the Fairey Band of twenty years ago, under the direction of its then Musical Director Kenneth Dennison, and with a team of soloists, two of whom we hear little of these days. The third, Philip McCann, subsequently left Fairey's to make a worldwide reputation as a soloist.

There are three marches and a march medley on this CD. Julius Fucik, composer of Entry of The Gladiators, was born in Prague and studied composition with Anton Dvořák, though his fame rests largely in a handful of military marches. This particular march is often associated with the 'big top'. Fame and Glory, on the other hand, is closely linked to our Festivals of Remembrance, held in November, while Knightsbridge March will bring back memories of 'In Town Tonight' to those 'of riper years'. It comes from the London Suite of Eric Coates, a true 'King of Light Music'.

The medley of Famous British Marches comprises some of the better-known regimental marches of the British Army, culminating in a rousing version by Langford of 'Rule Britannia'.

Marcus Cutts, a fine exponent of the euphonium in his day, treats us to his interpretations of Believe me, if All those Endearing Young Charms (in Gordon Langford's setting – not to be confused with an equally well-known version by Stanley Boddington) and To a Wild Rose, from a group of pieces by the American composer Edward MacDowell called Woodland Sketches.

Harry Foster, a trombonist from a wellknown brass band family, plays the everpopular **Angels Guard Thee**, Benjamin Godard's chief claim to fame.

Philip McCann's contrasting contributions are the challenging Fairies of the Waters and one of the best-loved tunes from *The* Gondoliers, Take a Pair of Sparkling Eyes.

As on most Chandos brass band recordings Gordon Langford features quite heavily, but mainly, on this occasion, in transcriptions of orchestral or operatic material. The one exception (apart from the march medley) is his by now classic version of When the Saints Go Marching in. This was one of Gordon's early ventures into band music and is one of the reasons why he made such an immediate impact.

Of the transcriptions on this CD none needs any introduction. Pay Ryan's version of Grieg's nostalgic Spring has without doubt stood the test of time, as has the Fifth Hungarian Dance of Brahms – a real piece of Gypsy music if ever there was one! The Finale from the Overture to 'William Tell', Thunder and Lightning and La Danza all receive exhilarating treatment and the Soldier's


Chorus from Faust has long been a 'standard'.

So 'Brass Favourites' certainly includes
many of my favourites – and I hope yours, too.


